## Wasatch Figure Skating Club Membership Benefits and Responsibilities

Benefits of a Full Home Club Member in the Wasatch Figure Skating Club will include:

- **USFSA Membership**: Member of the United States Figure Skating Association through June 30, 2015. WFSC will pay your membership dues to USFSA.
- One hour of WFSC Club Ice will be included\* for all WFSC Home Club Members and Introductory Members on our weekly club night.
  Second Club members and other members will be charged \$5.00/hr for each club ice session.
- **SKATING Magazine:** Receive monthly issues of **SKATING** magazines (one per household)
- **Test Sessions:** Eligible to take USFSA figure skating tests and receive certificates and patches and recognition for tests passed; WFSC will host test sessions during the 2014-15 season.
- Competitions: Eligible to compete in USFSA sanctioned figure skating competitions.
- Clinics: Participate in all clinics sponsored by the Wasatch Figure Skating Club.
- Show Performances/Exhibitions: Members are eligible to participate in WFSC shows. Participants must be full home club members in good standing. Qualifications for soloists include:
  - Skater must have competed at the pre-preliminary level.
  - o All fees must be current.
  - More detailed rules are available, check with the show director. You are responsible for following up and checking on all eligibility requirements.
- **WFSC Club Night:** Participation in WFSC Club Night activities, including the opening social. Holiday themed parties, mini-clinics and closing social.
- **WFSC Communications:** Receive WFSC newsletters online and informational notices. Log on to www.wasatchfigureskating.org
- WFSC Voting Privileges: Members over 18 are eligible to vote at General Membership Meetings.
- **Skater Support:** As a home club member you will receive support when you compete at the regional, sectional and national levels.

Member dues only cover a portion of the WFSC annual budget. Please support our fundraisers as they supplement the remainder of the funds that are needed to cover the budget. By supporting the fundraising opportunities you help to keep the membership rates to a minimum.

WFSC Home Club and Supporting Club Members are responsible for completing 15 volunteer hours per family during the Club season. An additional 15 hours are required during special club seasons when WFSC hosts large state, regional or national competitions. Please note that during the 2014-15 season, the WFSC will host the Intermountain Winter Classic and all members must contribute a minimum of 15 additional volunteer hours for this competition (Jan 29-31, 2015) for a total of 30 hours for the year. All hours need to be completed by June 30, 2015. Ideas for volunteer participation will be posted on the website and on the bulletin board. A form to help you keep track of your hours is attached or available on the club website. All forms will be turned into the club volunteer officer.

We understand that it can sometimes be difficult to volunteer your time. If you cannot make this commitment, you will be asked to pay \$100.00 to fulfill your volunteer obligation for a regular season and \$200 for a special season.
