

Wasatch Figure Skating Club Spring Ice Show – April 23 & 24 2021

“The Roaring 20’s”

We are excited to announce our Spring Show. We are happy to be able to still put on a show although things will be a little different this year given the restrictions put in place both by US Figure Skating and our Local Health Authorities. We look forward to working with all of you to make this show a lot of fun and a big success. Please review the following regarding participation fees, rehearsals, and costumes. Sign up will be online through Entryeeze this year and **MUST BE COMPLETED BY FRIDAY FEBRUARY 26, 2021**. *Note* Due to restrictions, there will not be a production number this year. However, it will be replaced with a fun finale for all the skaters.

Ice Show Guidelines and Information

- All WFSC members are eligible to participate in the ice show.
- The below show fees DO NOT include ice time or costume fees.
- Music/song selections will be made by the show directors that fits with the theme and flow of the show.

Show Fees: To be paid online at time of registration.

Solo: \$20

Step-out: \$15

Group number: \$30

Dress rehearsal: \$10 (Required)

Qualifications for a solo: (Pre-Preliminary W/Axel)

- Soloists must be a WFSC club member in good standing.
- Skaters must have competed in Pre-Preliminary (W/Axel) or above level to have a solo. Well Balanced, Showcase, Excel WITH AXEL equivalent level).
- Soloists will be responsible to provide their own costume and must pay the appropriate pro fees for program choreography. Music will be assigned.
- Soloists are to set a positive example to other skaters in their behavior and attitude.

Qualifications for a step-out/Duet/Trio: (Non-Test, Pre-Pre Excel)

- Skaters with Step-outs must be a WFSC club member in good standing.
- Skaters must have competed in No-Test/Pre-Pre Excel level or above to have a step-out.
- Step-outs will be responsible for their own costume and will meet with their own coach or plan lessons with group number coach at their own time and expense.
- Skaters must participate in all assigned group number rehearsals.
- Skaters are to set a positive example to other skaters in their behavior and attitude.
- Skaters may be assigned to a duet or a trio, depending on the number of skaters who qualify for a step-out.

Group Numbers:

- All WFSC skaters in good standing may participate in a club group number. In addition to Solo/Step-out if skater qualifies.
- Skaters will be put into groups that reflect the theme and flow of the show. Groups will not be based only on level of the skater.
- Group number assignments will be announced once sign-up is closed.
- Costumes will be assigned by the choreographer. Costume costs will be at the skater’s expense.

Group Rehearsal Information

- Practices will begin in March. Specific dates and times will be scheduled by the choreographer assigned to the group number.
- All practices are mandatory for all skaters.
- Skaters are expected to be on the ice ready to go ON TIME.
- One unexcused absence will be accepted at the discretion of the choreographer. Please contact your Choreographer if you know you will be missing a practice. (If your Spring Break dates conflict, please contact a Show Director to discuss participation as exceptions may be made).
- If a Choreographer feels that their particular group needs more rehearsal time, they may set up additional practice times.
- Due to the nature of preparing for a production such as this, practice time may change. Any changes to the set schedule will be posted and emailed out to participants affected ahead of time. Please be sure to check your email and possibly even your spam folder.
- All skaters are expected to treat all other skaters and coaches with respect. Inappropriate behavior and poor attitudes will result in dismissal from the show. No reimbursements will be given if a skater is dismissed.

Mandatory Dress Rehearsal:

- Mandatory rehearsal for ALL SKATERS participating in the show.
- Rehearsal will take place Wednesday, April 21, 2021 4:30-6:30
- Skaters are required to be ready to take the ice when rehearsal starts. We will not hold for anyone due to limited time.
- Due to Covid-19 dinner WILL NOT be provided this year.

Mask Mandate:

US Figure Skating requires all sanctioned events to follow a 100% mask mandate as does the Weber County Health Department. All participants, coaches, chaperones, spectators, volunteers, etc are required to wear a mask at ALL times while inside The Weber County Ice Sheet. Failure to comply with this rule will result in immediate dismissal from the facility. There will be NO exception to this rule.

This rule also applies to skaters on the ice when closer than 6 feet. Because of this, US Figure Skating requires masks to be worn in group number performances. Skaters will be required to wear a mask during group number rehearsals and performances.

Tickets:

Show Performances:

Friday and Saturday, April 23 and 24 at 7:30 pm. Skaters should be at the arena no later than 6:30pm. Soloist warm-up will be announced closer to performance. Please note show performance dates and check availability before registering. Skaters are expected to participate in both performances.

Register online at entryeze.com. You will be asked to answer the following questions while registering.

- Skating level: Fill in your skater's level for all skating disciplines. If they have not done any advanced testing there will be an option for non-test skaters.
- Agreements: Completing an online form is an agreement that the skater and parent have both read the entire application and will follow ice show guidelines. Both the skater and parent will do what they can to make this the best experience for everybody involved.
